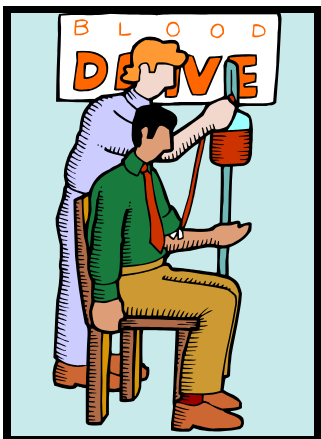

Progress

In the January 30th Edition of the Brenham Banner-Press; in its Progress Section, subsections: Community and Neighbors you will find a couple of very interesting articles submitted by Angela Hahn. The first article Angela submitted was titled "Protecting the streets – Meet the women of the Brenham PD". Angela's article gives us a glimpse into the lives, both professional and personal, of BPD's four women officers: Cpl. Casey Thumann, Ashley Burns, Heather Sowders and rookie officer Sierra Newell. Angela did a great job interviewing these ladies and putting their views and quotes in print. The article was complete with photos of our "better looking" officers.

Angela had another article in the same publication titled "Police department focused on ensuring safety in schools". She starts her article by talking about BPD's efforts in keeping our schools safe, "providing a sense of well-being for parents and teachers, enhance safety and security at all campuses, and build a good rapport with the kids in the elementary schools". She quotes Chief Phelps as saying "we believe if we can build and maintain a good relationship with our youth, we can prevent some of the juvenile crime we saw this past summer".

Her article then shifts gears to crime statistics, then traffic concerns, STEP grants (Selective Traffic Enforcement Program), and how those efforts showed great results. The article goes on with very interesting stats and even states what we (BPD) will be doing in 2015. We will be instituting "Geographical or District Policing" (**Chief Phelps will explain the aspects of District Policing at our next General Meeting, February 9th**). We will also be "utilizing an experienced, retired crime analyst who will be working with officers to ensure that our intelligence is gathered, analyzed and shared throughout the department". Chief Phelps was also quoted as saying that our COP program, and its dedicated COPs, played a very important role in the accomplishments of the department in 2014 and into the future.

Finally, Angela's article spoke about Chief Phelps' strides in getting a much needed new Animal Shelter for the community, and the work still left to do. Chief Phelps's final quotes closed the article, emphasizing how fortunate we are "to continue to have the support of our Mayor and Council; of the City administration and staff; of the Sheriff and his department; and the County and District Attorneys' offices. And most important, to have the support of this community".

Thank you Angela for putting the BPD in such a good light with our constituency. I know that it's the job of the Public Information Officer, but **THANKS for doing your job so well!**

P.S.: That same Edition on page D11 had a nice article (with photo) about our long time CPAAA members Keith and Elizabeth Twiggs and their first Sonic Restaurant. Keith and Elizabeth brought the first Sonic to Brenham some forty years ago; it was located on Market Street. Their second location opened a few years ago on Day Street; its success and the fact that refurbishing was cost prohibitive led to the closure of the

Market Street location.

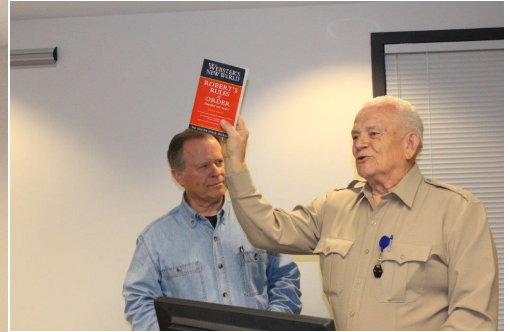
