
National Police Week - 5/10-16/15

Just one way to say THANK YOU for all that you do!






COP APPRECIATION DINNER



Travis Pilcheck and I were leaving for Washington D.C. to see the Korean War Veterans Memorial along with the other war memorials. It was a trip to be remembered for a life time.

The Honor Flight Austin group did it up right and really knows how to treat a veteran to a real nice trip. From the time we left Austin to our return to Austin we were treated like royalty. A person met me at the curb with a wheelchair and from that point on you was assigned a guardian that stayed with you the entire trip, pushing you all over Washington to every memorial and every event. Although' Travis chose not to take the wheelchair his guardian stayed with him all the time. We were treated to a banquet style meal upon arrival at the Hilton hotel where we spent the night. The next day (Saturday) the day begin with a breakfast buffet then on to the busses to start our day of making the rounds to the various war memorials. This trip being for Korean War Veterans we went to the Korean War Veterans Memorial first where we watched a program honoring the Korean War Veterans. Then it was on to the other memorials, WW-2, Viet-Nam, Marine, Air Force, DAV and Navy. I must say the WW-2 Memorial was most beautiful with the Korean War Veterans Memorial a close second. After a day of drinking a lot of water, eating box lunches and snack bars we were well taken care of by the Honor Flight Austin folks. On our flight back to Austin we had "Mail Call", something that had been arranged by the Honor Flight Folks. 
