

The Lake Loons are made up of many motorcycle clubs and riders from the Lake Somerville, Snook and Brenham area that come together for this rewarding endeavor. Even our own COP Tony Smith was among the riders this year. Hats off to them for their hard work planning, fundraising, researching the families, shopping, making this ride in all kinds of weather and lastly making Holiday Wishes come true for so many. They saved the best for last; Brenham had their last three stops this Holiday Season. Then the riders would head back home by way of their favorite watering hole in Snook. Why not, after a full day of spreading holiday cheer; they deserve a little holiday cheer too!

The Washington County Citizens On Patrol (WCCOP) and the Brenham Citizens On Patrol (BCOP) were out in full force that Saturday afternoon to ensure a smooth ride thru Washington County and the streets of Brenham for the 80 motorcycles and various cars, trucks and trailers that were making this ever important trek. WCCOP's picked up the motor heads at the northern Washington County Line, one vehicle took the lead and the second brought up the rear as the group moved thru the County. When the convoy reached Blue Bell at Hwy 36 N, BCOP's took the lead, escorting the group to their first stop here on Clayton Street. We parked our patrol units to mingle with the group and watched as they brought cheer to the family on Clayton Street. We noticed that several group members grabbed wrapped and unwrapped gifts and stuffed animals and distributed them to the surrounding households and to kids in the neighborhood that stopped to watch what was going on. It was on to our next location on W. Main Street. The large enclosed trailer that was nouce full of gifts and toys was becoming empty.
