
NATIONAL POLICE WEEK



The EOC

It was your typical rainy Thursday in May. I had been in phone contact with Chris Jackson throughout the day; we were discussing the COP Traffic Control Class scheduled for that evening, and would the rain subside in time. We decided to change the subject of tonight's session from Traffic Control to the Haz-Mat Awareness Class. But, what neither of us knew was the magnitude of the rain event currently in progress.

Then, news of a tornado touching down in the Bryan/College Station area hit the air waves. The National Weather Service called for a tornado watch in our area. The skies were ominously dark in every direction; and then the rains came! The rains progressed tremendously in the next few hours; and we decided to cancel classes due to inclement weather. Well, two weather related fire/rescue calls later; I finally got a chance to make the cancellation phone calls to our eager group of COP Candidates.

It was apparent that this was a significant rain event and not of the 100 year variety, but rather the 500 year type; as we got from 17 to 25 inches of rain in just 24 hours. April was quite a rainy month for us; but May was proving to be disastrous. Well, instead of teaching a COP Class, I found myself at the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) at the Brenham Fire Department; and it was bustling. I was deployed to assist Sealy FD in their "high profile" people transport truck. This truck was high off the ground like our MRAP but was not as heavy. We were dispatched for a rescue at New Years Creek and Old Navasota Road, but when we arrived it looked like New Years Lake, unpassable even with our vehicle. We did not get to the person we were sent to rescue, but rather took a lady out of her flooding home to safety (our intended victim was rescued by Myersville FD who came in from the other direction). Sealy was not the only outside help that we had here in Brenham. We had 10 boat crews to assist our 2; they were from Austin/Travis County, San Antonio, Denton, Ft. Worth, and Longview, courtesy of Texas Task Force One and STREC. Upon my arrival back at the EOC, I was asked to help with dispatching of road crews and electric department personnel.

It was amazing to see the EOC in operation, with everyone working in unison; just as it was meant to! Police Chief Craig Goodman was dispatching all of the police calls using his handheld radio. He was assisted by his new best friend Firefighter/Paramedic and former Dispatcher Josh Vandever. Fire Chief Ricky Boeker was dispatching the fire calls aided by Firefighter Josh Sebastian. Asst. Chief Brian Scheffer, a former Dispatcher and Firefighter/IT and former Dispatcher Pam Ruemke were dispatching EMS calls and County calls. County Emergency Management Coordinator Brian Ruemke and EMS Lt. Justin Knippel were on hand helping with boat rescue calls and allocating other resources. County Judge John Brieden was there doing what he could to assist; especially with the allocation of outside resources. There were a few more people there, but glaringly absent were representatives from the street department and the utility department. I guess that's why I was tasked with contacting the street and electric departments. I also got coffee and water for the busy dispatchers. And, I also cleaned up said coffee when a certain Police Chief had an "oops" moment. It's all in a day's work or in this case, a night's work!

The EOC was working like a well-oiled machine, things were humming. Things were getting done, people were getting rescued, and shelters were being set up. The shelter at Alton Elementary was shut down because it took on water and it was replaced by Krause Elemenatary. The Fireman's Training Center was also designated as a shelter (myself and Clarence Steinfeld were stationed there on Friday and Saturday as COPs at the request of the Police Chief). Police, Fire and EMS were working together seamlessly and side-by-side. The Emergency Operations Center was working as it was supposed to work, and all on the spur of the moment, by some who had never worked together before or had been put in that situation before. I shouldn't say it was amazing, but it was a sight to see. I was so glad I got to see our EOC in action; it was a great experience. A BIG THANK YOU to all of the men and women that were there to help Brenham in its time of need!!

Our New S.W.A.T. Team

Who knew the Brenham Police Department had a new S.W.A.T. team? With the addition of our MRAP vehicle, which now has a brand new paint job, a little more training, the right equipment and the right circumstances; we got a new S.W.A.T. team. All those things came together the evening of May 26th; that's right, the night of our epic storm. The team's personnel didn't change, but their normal role of protecting the citizens of our community shifted dramatically.

Our Special Weapons And Tactics team (SWAT) was transformed into our new Swift Water Assault Team (SWAT). I was there to witness firsthand the fine job our new SWAT team did that night; and they did it over and over again. Having the "high profile" MRAP was a big help in the rescue efforts that night and the next day; as it could go places normal vehicles couldn't. But it was the personnel that made things happen; that made the rescues have positive outcomes. And those personnel should be commended! I did not get a look at all the officers on board the MRAP or out on patrol, but here is a short list of those that I did see or know were part of the rescue efforts: Captain Trey Gully, Captain Lloyd Powell, Sergeant Curtiss Schoen, Sergeant Seth Klehm, Cpl. Chris Jackson, Cpl. Richard Bobbitt, Cpl. Joe Merkley, Cpl. Lance Weiss, Cpl. Jared Campbell, Cpl. David Dudenhoeffer, Cpl. Eduardo Ortega, Cpl. Todd Ashorn, Ofc. Kevin Mertz, Ofc. Hunter Andras, Ofc. Jose Perez, Ofc. Terrence Johnson, Ofc. Andy Adams. These brave officers and command officers were assisted by members of the Brenham Fire Department, Ryan Swor, Brent Folsom, and Chris, McCain. They were dispatched by Police Chief Craig Goodman and Fire Chief Ricky Boeker, out of the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) which was the Police and Fire Department's Dispatch Office for that evening. Our new Swift Water Assault Team was credited with dozens of saves; plucking citizens out of high water, flooded cars and homes. Our SWAT team practices guite often for such things as building breaches, school shootings and the like. Perhaps next time their training will include some ropes, knots, PFDs, and swift water rescue techniques. Hopefully there will not be a need to press our MRAP and new SWAT team into action, but be assured that if the need arises, the men and women of the Brenham Police Department SWAT team will be ready!
