



No Shave November

"No Shave November" is back at the Brenham Police Department. Starting October 1st and continuing through the end of November, members of the department will be allowed to grow facial hair in an effort to raise money for Adam's Angel Ministries.

Adam's Angels Ministries offers care and support to families with children fighting cancer. The organization also works to raise funds for cancer research. The Officers will be allowed to grow a beard or goatee if they personally donate at least \$25 a month to the charity. Officers can have a sponsor or sponsors to help in the fundraising effort; so that \$25 a month can be much, much more. Certain grooming standards must be maintained while on duty to ensure that they continue to present a professional appearance to the public.

The idea came from Sgt. Justin Schiller, last year. He said that the officers could donate the amount that they would normally spend on shaving to cancer research. It would be a good way for them to participate in a great cause, raise funds and raise awareness of one of the many challenges that cancer patients face - the loss of hair. While the BPD policy prohibits beards and goatees (except for Undercover Officers), the Chief thinks that this will give officers an opportunity to have a relaxed grooming standard for the benefit of a great charity.

Our officers have always been very supportive of Adam's Angels and are happy for the opportunity to get hairy in the name of charity. The Police Department has challenged all First Responders in the area to participate in No Shave November and raise funds in the fight against cancer. I know that the Fire Department can't accept the challenge because beards interfere with the breathing equipment that they wear, but I am sure that they will happily donate to the cause; at least I will.
