Cpl. David Earl Webb

There are so many things we didn't know about Brenham Police Department (BPD) Cpl. David Webb; even those closest to him were finding out different things about this quiet, passionate Police Officer that loved the children he encountered at Brenham Jr. High School. His co-workers, school administrators and teachers would speak of the special bond David had with his Jr. High students, "his angels". I only had a passing friendship with Cpl. Webb, as I do with most of the BPD family; however, in speaking with several officers, especially Cpl. Lance Weiss, I learned a great deal.

David Earl Webb was born on October 6, 1962 in Gainesville, Florida. He was brought up in a Christian home with loving parents. He had 6 brothers and 4 sisters (3 brothers and 1 sister preceded him in death). David graduated from Gainesville High School, where in 1981, as Captain of their football team, he led them to their first State Championship in the school's history. David was also Captain of the schools wrestling team and had the longest undefeated streak in school history. He was named a High School All-American. He received an athletic scholarship to Northeastern A & M Jr. College. He attended Oklahoma State University and completed his undergrad work in Health Education at Langston University with a Master's Degree in Urban Education.

David served the BPD for the past 5 years and loved his job as a School Resource Officer. He told many it was his dream job, because he could help shape young minds and attitudes, making an impact on our youth. I was told by Cpl. Weiss that he attended a school program where David recited Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King's (MLK) famous "I Have A Dream" speech. He said he was brought to tears by David's delivery of those famous words. I later learned that David delivered that speech and several other MLK speeches to other schools and churches; and all from memory using similar inflections and a passion for Dr. King's words. He chose to emulate Dr. King, and in doing so had an even greater positive impact on our youth.
