or go outside and feel the blow.*

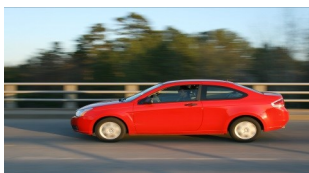
Later the sky turns black,

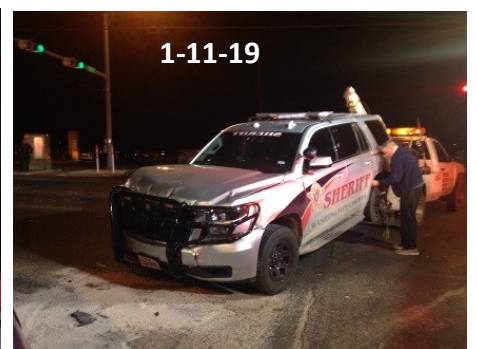

They are not here to replace anyone's current church or pastoral relationships, but to offer themselves as additional professional resources for personal one-on-one ministry, counseling, pastoral care for the sick and injured, and assistance wherever they may be needed. Some of this service will be interfacing with the public as needed. For example, two of them have already been called upon to help notify and comfort relatives of deceased loved ones.

The current Chaplains are Rev. Johnnie Williams, Rev. Billy Sutherland, Rev. Calvin Kossie, Rev. Randy Wells, and Rev. Kris Brower. They are all experienced clergy; all are active members of the Washington County Ministerial Alliance. In the coming months we will be profiling them in this publication for your information. They have been given special "Police Chaplain" badges and jackets to use for identification when they are involved in police business and or events. We hope that you will welcome them, get to know them and utilize them when the need arises. For now, please coordinate any contacts through Sgt. Steven Eilert.
