

A while back, a citizen sent this picture to our Deer Park Police Department. Officer Del Wilcoxson had no idea that anyone had taken his picture that day! While working an extra job for a track meet at the North Campus a few months ago, he was walking around and started talking with some of the young kids that were there. The next thing he knew, they began coming up to him and asking all kinds of questions and even sitting on his knee. In his words, "it was precious." He was unaware that anyone had taken the photo and when he saw it, said it "touched him deeply". He went on to say that "this is how it is between police officers and our citizens 99% of the time, but unfortunately, some like to take the negative 1% and make claims that officers are prejudice and target according to race." "But, this picture is a true example of the relationships between officers and citizens within our community!"

Recently, Officers with the Deer Park Police Department responded to a call for help from a female suffering a mental health crisis. We were able to intervene and take her to get the help she needed but left in the wake was this 18 month old child. Officers quickly stepped up to help with several going to their own houses in the city to get food and clothing for the child. Once back at the PD the child became very sleepy which led to being very fussy. While many of our officers and staff tried to calm the child it was Officer M. Flores who succeeded and was able to get the child down for a nap while we awaited the arrival of a guardian.
