2015-2016 ELECTIONS
Houston Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association

It's that time again - elections. No, not the Democrats versus the Republicans. But the 2015-2016 elections for the Houston Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association.

The nominating committee was named at our July meeting. It was elected by the membership and the committee will elect its chair. According to the bylaws, The President will not serve as a member of nor have the authority to appoint any member of the committee.

To be nominated to the committee, you must be a member in "good standing" as do candidates for each elective office. A member in good standing shall be a person who has paid the current association dues and has 25 volunteer hours each year. The committee will report its list of nominees at the September meeting. At that time, additional nominations may be made from members in attendance.

Our officers are president, first and second vice president, secretary, treasurer and parliamentarian. In addition, there are three directors-at-large elected for three year terms and one is elected each year.



Recap of July 14th Citywide PIP Meeting

Captain G. J. Fremin, commander of Northeast Patrol, spoke at the July 14 Citywide P.I.P. meeting on the hot topic "Bank Jugging." The term is used to describe suspects who sit in bank parking lots and watch customers go in and out of a bank. The suspects follow the customers they believe are in possession of cash and look for an opportunity to burglarize their vehicles or rob them directly. Fremin said bank jugging is a complex matter. The crooks watch people leave financial institutions with bank bags. "They may have \$10,000, \$20,000 or even \$80,000 in cash," Fremin said. "Business owners that make a large withdrawal should go straight to their destinations."

Some have been robbed, they resist and are killed. "Don't set yourself up to become a victim," he added.

Bank robberies have been another challenge for Captain Fremin. He said a group of arrests were recently made as a result of a Crimestoppers tip. "They all lived in my area," he said of the crooks. The Northeast district is the largest patrol station geographically," he added. It serves about 190,000 citizens of which 51% are Hispanic and 42% are African American. The station has 317 classified officers and a total count of 350 people.

In the absence of Chief Charles A. McClelland Jr., Executive Assistant Chief Martha Montalvo said crime statistics on property crime are pretty good, down about 5% compared to the previous year. There is a spike in violent crime and that's because of homicides, she said. What's driving this is gun violence and gangs, which is not unique to our city. "The common denominator is repeat offenders," she said.

Chief Montalvo also touched on the department's budget saying

that it has been passed by the mayor and city council. She indicated 94% of the police department budget is for personnel. The budget will fund four cadet classes during the fiscal year, up from the usual three. While this may produce up to 280 officers, Montalvo said this is not keeping up with the pace of those retiring - about 250 this past year. "We are an aging department," she added. "Our average age is 43."

The Chief invited P.I.P. members to attend the July 27 dedication ceremonies naming police headquarters after Officer Edward Alfred Thomas who served HPD for 60 years. One of the longest serving employees, Thomas was here pre-civil rights, the chief said. He was always referred to as Mr. Thomas, never Officer Thomas, she added. The ceremony will be held at 1200 Travis on July 27th at 10:30 am.

Also discussing crime statistics was Captain M. W. Martin who is in charge of the Crime Analysis and the Command Center. He attributed the reduction of non violent crime, in part, to people not leaving things in their car. He said violent crime was down 7% in the last 30 days compared to the year ago period. Regarding violent crime, he said the murders that are occurring usually involve someone known by the victim. A major spurt was robberies of cell phone stores. "We got some of them and they are in jail.," he said. This year there have been 2,150 cell phones stolen in Houston. While 96% of the population have cell phones, 30 to 40% of the robberies involve cell phones. The most common areas are apartment complexes, he said. It is easy to steal a phone and run off. He recommends a kill switch that could be set after a phone was stolen making it unusable. California has passed a law requiring such a switch.

President Abraham Guevara said a budget committee will begin its task for the upcoming fiscal year.
