The Center has only been open for about two weeks and we have received nothing but praise from the community. Anthony has been doing a great job holding down the fort, but we really would love to see a core group of CPAAA Volunteers commit to spending some time in the office down there (Monday thru Friday-anytime from 8AM to 5PM). Finally, I am so proud to share that our department was again recognized by the Texas Police Chief's Association. The LPPD was formally presented with a beautiful "Re-Recognition" plaque at last Monday's City Council Meeting for our continued compliance with Texas Police Chiefs Association (TPCA) Best Practices Recognition Program for Law Enforcement. Webster Chief of Police Danny Presley, Team Leader representing the TPCA Recognition Program, presented the certificate.

While making the presentation, Chief Presley put the accomplishment in perspective by sharing with Council that "there are over 2400 Law Enforcement agencies in Texas, and only 144 agencies have achieved 'Recognized' status. Only 67 agencies have been Re-Recognized.....meaning that they have maintained these standards for more than 4 years. The fact that the La Porte Police department has maintained these standards for 8 years in a row means that your Department is among the top 3% of all police agencies in the State."

The Law Enforcement Recognition Program is a voluntary process where police agencies in Texas prove their continued compliance with over 168 Texas Law Enforcement Best Practices covering all aspects of police operations. While being "Recognized" is no guarantee an agency will not make a mistake, it does ensure that the agency has studied these critical issues, developed policy and procedures to address them, and has systems in place for the identification and correction of <u>problems</u>. In short, this process helps us ensure that we are providing our community with the best possible law enforcement services!

I am also so proud to mention that, at the same City Council meeting, two of our own received individual awards for their distinguished service over the last year. Lt. Matt Daeumer was recognized as the City of La Porte's Manager of the Year and Animal Control Supervisor Clarence Anderson was recognized as the Employee of the Year. Both recognitions were well earned and deserved. Please shake Matt and Clarence's hand the next time you see them. We'll that's it for now. Hope to see you all soon.
