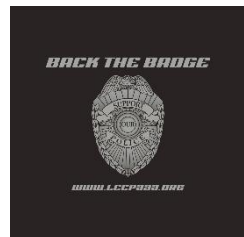

June 2016 Officer of the Month

Officer Jason Hall with K9 Dina



Officer Jason Hall joined the League City Police Department in January 2010. Since that time he has served in the Patrol Division and the Traffic Division. His current assignment is to the K9 Division. His partner, Dina, is a 4 year old Belgian Malinois who was born in Hungary. Officer Hall is also a certified Mental Health Peace Officer, a Field Training Officer, an Advanced Crash Investigator, and served as a Hostage Negotiator for 4 years. Officer Hall also loves to play guitar and spend time with his family.

As a member of the K9 Division, Officer Hall is not dispatched to minor accidents. Last April, when he saw all patrol officers were involved in other calls, Officer Hall responded to an accident that had taken place. Upon arrival at the scene, Officer Hall realized there was a small child who was likely very shaken up by what had just happened. He did everything he possibly could to make the following minutes more comfortable for her. Once the accident scene had been cleared, Officer Hall and K9 Dina held a small demonstration for the family involved in the accident and several other children from the neighborhood. The email below was sent to Chief Kramm by the husband/father of those involved in the accident.

"I want to take this time to thank LCPD and Mr. Hall for their excellent work capturing the 17 year old that ran into a good friend of mine and then ramming into my wife with my 5 year old daughter. I want to take this time to thank Mr. Hall for such a great experience during such a horrible day, my daughter had a nasty bump on her head and he asked if we needed EMS. I of course said yes. He told EMS not to run code to the scene knowing that my daughter would be highly freaked out. Once EMS arrived he was so polite and friendly to my daughter and was able to convince her to allow the EMT's to take a look at her head. After they took a look at her, he brought her a stuffed animal that he had in his car (this just brightened her day). Once all of his accident investigation was done he brought out he K-9 to show all the kids, THEY LOVED IT. I just want to say this officer went above and beyond just being a police officer and makes it one of the reasons I love living in League City."

For his service and dedication to the City of League City, Officer Hall was presented a plaque and a gift at the Alumni general meeting on Thursday, June 9th.
