Leo Waltz reported on how he worked with the Red Cross during and after the hurricane 100 people working with a majority being volunteers from all over the states as well as Australia. Texas had 6,000 paid members & volunteers. There were 241 shelters over all of Texas and as far away as Amarillo. 37 kitchens open and 8 million meals were served over a 90 day period.

**Activity Reports:**

**Lake Jackson CPAAA:**

A Disabled Parking Marathon was held Friday and Saturday, November 13 & 14. Thirty-one citations were written.

Our November general meeting had guest speaker Andrea Schmauss, Regional Council Leadership Chair. Alumni of the year Roy McKneely was recognized at the meeting.

Child ID is being done in area schools. October 28 through November 18, students getting their picture and ID totaled 32 students at Bess Brannan school in Lake Jackson, 49 at T. W. Ogg school in Clute, and 58 at Elizabeth Ney in Lake Jackson, and 63 at Velasco Elementary in Freeport. Two more schools are scheduled for December.
